to **Bond Street** then change to **Jubilee**) **Trail length:** 5km **Trail Time:** approx 2-3 hours
The Women of Courage Family Trail follows in the footsteps of the inspirational women who made London great. Put on some comfortable shoes and don't forget your thinking caps! 
